I am an experienced Planning professional with diverse knowledge and expertise; having worked across the State and local Government, private enterprise, and small business sectors in the capacities of Local Planning Panel (LPP) Expert Member, Planning Consultant, Senior Town Planner and Senior Strategic Planner.

Issues require a holistic approach towards reaching an equitable solution; with the ability to listen, probe, research/analyse and lead discussion being paramount to effective resolution. Matters presenting to these LPP's involve government or public submissions, and have included:
 1. Infill development e.g., Lane Cove and Mascot.
 2. Emerging development that can be attributed to the intended uplift of previous planning controls, and/or gentrification due to proximity to commercial centres and public transport e.g., Marrickville and Botany.
 3. Interface development and the degree of equitable variation of existing planning provisions e.g., residential, commercial/ residential, industrial zones, and major transport infrastructure corridors e.g., Parramatta Road and Rockdale.
 4. Extension of entertainment trading hours, and the resultant noise, safety, parking, and privacy impacts/ considerations for nearby residents e.g., Balmain and Petersham.
 5. Changes in the intensity of previous land uses e.g., increased night-time lighting and parking impact sports fields in Bayside.
 6. Impact on heritage items and heritage conservation areas e.g., Ashfield and Summer Hill.
 7. Major modifications to large scale mixed development that will increase demand for services and facilities (public transport, preschools, schools, open space) e.g., Eastgardens and Rockdale.

Responsibilities:

- Preparation of DA's including the creation of Statements of Environmental Effects (SEE's) – selection, briefing and management of specialist consultants; analysis of architectural/other plans

- flooding, hydrological, stormwater, vegetation, landscaping, heritage and ecological; lodgement of DA's; stakeholder meetings; and presentation at formal Council/LPP meetings.

- Preparation of Planning Proposals – develop consultant briefs for architects, planners, and urban designers towards peer reviews; management of specialist consultants; ensure alignment to new Government strategic framework, including District Plans and Local Strategic Planning Statements (LSPS).
- Management of Urban Design strategies – develop consultant recruitment brief, sit on selection panels and manage incoming incumbent; co-ordinate community facilitation and engagement sessions; train and motivate staff in the Community Engagement process.
- Preparation of submissions to State Government.
- Representation of property owners and groups in resolving and mediating land use and town planning matters (neighbours, property owners and local Councils).
- Development of objection letters to Council e.g. Seniors Housing development.
- Preparation of Development Control Plans, including major strategic planning projects.
- Stakeholder advice on property development potential and compliance with planning requirements (including legislative changes).
- Heritage Conservation interpretation and advice.

Key Projects:

- Development application (DA) assessments at Bayside, Central Coast, North Sydney, Wingecarribee and Wollondilly Councils. The applications are diverse and include major residential, commercial, industrial, mixed use, Seniors Housing and heritage statutory planning projects and modifications (e.g., Tahmoor East and Bowral).
- Preparation of significant planning proposals for Ku Ring Gai and Canterbury Bankstown Council, including major rezoning and development “uplifts” in central Bankstown (University of Western Sydney (UWS) Bankstown campus), Padstow and Punchbowl (Club Punchbowl). The UWS project was commended by the Greater Sydney Commission in its annual awards in June 2021. Significant change and growth in this area has seen key infrastructure projects such as the South West Metro line and the Aerotropolis requiring reference/consideration in ongoing decision-making processes.
- Management of Mascot Local Centre Urban Design Strategy for Bayside Council.
- Preparation of a submission to the State government that resulted in funding for the Review of the (then) Botany Bay Heritage Study.
- Preparation of DA's for individual clients and organisations, including statements of environmental effects, to be lodged with various Councils e.g., Northcross Christian School at Ryde. This project required significant amendment and rationalisation of previous plans, lodgement of a series of DA's and a subsequent planning proposal to address the future needs of the School. Strategic input was provided into the school's master planning process.
- Representation of numerous private property owners and groups in resolving and mediating on land use and town planning matters between neighbours, property owners and local Councils. Cammeray and Mosman – increased heights and FSR issues. Turramurra – inappropriate inclusion of commercial properties as heritage items. Balgowlah – illegal tree removal, excessive ground level increase, entertainment facilities to the neighbour boundary – privacy and overlooking impacts. Mosman – clarification provided on inaccurate information provided in relation to view impacts following neighbour objections.
- Major strategic planning projects including preparation of a development control plan for the Port Botany State Environmental Planning Policy (SEPP) area, and provision of heritage conservation advice for Bayside Council.
- Provision of advice to various stakeholders on the development potential of property and compliance with planning requirements, often the result of legislative change. This is in addition to

straightforward, practical development control and heritage conservation interpretation and advice in areas including Willoughby, Mosman, and Hunters Hill local government areas.
